

# Why celebrate us?

## **Investigation Questions:**

INVESTIGATION 1: How do we celebrate? INVESTIGATION 2: What is NAIDOC? INVESTIGATION 3: What will we perform?

INVESTIGATION 4: What do we have to organise?



Corresponding TROP	Investigation 2: What is NAIDOC?
TROP 3	What is an acronym? What does NAIDOC stand for?
TROP 3	What is our history? Where did it all begin? Timeline some events.
TROP 3	What is culture? What is our culture?

Corresponding TROP	Investigation 3: What are we going to perform?
TROP 3	Brainstorm ideas on what we could perform (poems, songs, dance, play).
TROP 4,5,6,8 and 12	Get into groups - work out what groups want to perform - how does it link to NAIDOC? Discuss roles and responsibilities in a group.

Corresponding TROP	Investigation 3: What are we going to perform?
TROP 3	Look at examples of dreamtime stories, poems, dances etc
TROP 2 and 3	What do we need to make a good performance? (discuss criteria - loud, clear voice, miming, body language, audience interaction)
TROP 1,3.5 and 6	Develop and practice performance in groups.
TROP 3	Make regular journal entries on the progress of performance.
TROP 3	Practice in front of other groups. Give each other ideas and advice.
TROP	Practice performance in front of another class

Corresponding TROP	Investigation 4: What do we have to organise?
TROP 10 and 11	Brainstorm what we need to organise. Draw up a unit plan to work out when everything needs to be done (inc set up and clean up)
TROP 3,4,6 and 12	Get into groups and delegate tasks.
TROP 1,3 and 6	Decide on a backdrop. Design it and do first copy.
TROP 3	Answer When? Where? Who? How? Questions. Design invitations. Type and send out.
TROP 3 and 11	Arrange transport for parents (Who will pick them up? Times to pick up etc) Make up and send out notes - room for response.
TROP 3 and 8	Make regular journal entries on groups and task progress.
TROP 1,3	Decide on props and costumes - where they will come from and how they will be made.
TROP 3 and 11	Make a program of order and time of performances.
TROP 12	Make a whole performance script (when does set need to be changed?) What will they do if something goes wrong?
TROP 9	Get info back from who is coming. Organise what to eat and drink, how much each person will eat and drink and how much we will need to get altogether.
